One who unlocks truth for others.

You might be a TEACHER if you...

- Love experiences where you get to learn
- Are curious, ask a lot of questions and love understanding how things work
- Own a lot of books and can't get to them all
- Get excited about the truth and want that it to be transformative in people's lives
- Love inspiring quotations
- Get jazzed around the question, 'what are you learning?'
- Enjoy assignments
- Cherish clarity
- Dig researching things
- Re-write someone else's talk in your head
- Go to Dictionary.com or Bible Gateway like some do Candy Crush
- Play Scrabble or other word games because words are a big deal to you
- Think in metaphors and constantly translate things for others, often saying things like, 'It's like...' or 'Think of it this way...'
- Have a unique ability to take a large volume of information and organize it in a way that people can understand

TEACHERS might enjoy a job or opportunities in...

• Education, science, philosophy, history, publishing, engineering, parenting, coaching or any field where you get to learn and explain to others

Some key contributions you bring to the Body of Christ include...

- You call, encourage, instruct and help folks to change
- You offer wisdom and guidance
- You provide unbelievers a tenable, intellectually grounded reason for your faith
- You share what you are learning in your own life, which can be a catalyst for others to change
- You help folks get unstuck in their faith
- As parents and grandparents, you can age-appropriately teach your kids and grandkids
- You teach others in a way that ignites transformation in any setting
- You take advantage of teachable moments with others

Ways you get stuck or frustrated/Traps you can fall into are...

- You can think that you are always right and not be open to learning from others.
- You may accumulate a lot of head knowledge but not apply it to your own life.
- You might over-talk about what you are learning.
- You can confuse a great talk for life change.
- In your personal life, confuse 'learning something' for actually 'doing something.'
- You can rely upon your intellect (rather than the authority that comes from Scripture and the Holy Spirit) to impress people.

Places in the Bible where we see this role in Jesus/others are...

- Matthew 5-7 Jesus, preaching the Sermon on the Mount
- Acts 18 Priscilla, teaching Apollos 'the way of God more adequately'
- Acts 2:14-39 Peter, preaching on the Day of Pentecost
- Acts 17 Paul, addressing people in Athens

Some ways you can more fully step into your kingdom role...

- Engage in learning whenever you can listen to sermons, podcasts, studying scripture, read, go to conferences, take a class, etc.
- Make learning a priority in your schedule.
- Teach kids at Heartland. (Contact Liz at <u>lizm@heartlandchurch.org</u> to take a tour and find out how easy it can be!)
- Start a Journey Community in your neighborhood or lead a table at Heartland.
- Join 'The Journey' writers team.
- Volunteer in your kid's classroom at school (or homeschool).
- Intentionally mentor, disciple, or develop one other person.
- Offer to teach others about an area of passion (for example: gardening, cooking, fixing a car, home improvement, woodworking...).
- Blog or write about what God is teaching you and share that with others.
- Invest in Bible commentaries.
- Facilitate a book study.
- Pursue deep conversations with folks around the questions 'What is God saying to you?' and 'What are you doing about it?'
